<p><b>Silk</b> A fine, strong, soft fibre collected from silkworm cocoons used to make thread and fabric.</p>	<p><b>Organic</b> Derived from living matter.</p>
<p><b>Jade</b> Jade is the name given to the minerals nephrite and jadeite. These hard stones are often decoratively carved.</p>	<p><b>Katana</b> A long, single-edged Japanese sword.</p>
<p><b>Prosperity</b> Wealthy successful and profitable.</p>	<p><b>Netsuke</b> A small toggle often carved, that was used to attach items to sashes worn with Japanese robes (kimonos).</p>
<p><b>Scroll</b> A written work or painting that is rolled.</p>	<p><b>Illuminated manuscript</b> Handwritten books that have been decorated with ornamental designs and/or miniatures.</p>
<p><b>Fable</b> A short story, typically with animals as characters, conveying a moral.</p>	<p><b>Perspective</b> The art of representing three-dimensional objects on a two-dimensional surface so as to give the right impression of their height, width, depth, and position in relation to each other.</p>
<p><b>Persia</b> Former official name of Iran, ancient empire that extended from Egypt to India.</p>	<p><b>Mughal</b> Conquerors and rulers of India from 1525 to 1857.</p>
<p><b>Mughal</b> Conquerors and rulers of India from 1525 to 1857.</p>	<p><b>Nirvana</b> Escape from the cycle of rebirths.</p>
<p><b>Calligraphy</b> Decorative handwriting.</p>	<p><b>Ritual</b> A system of religious or regular observances.</p>
<p><b>Binding</b> The act of attaching the pages of a book together and securing it within a cover; or the cover itself.</p>	<p><b>Hajj</b> Pilgrimage to Mecca.</p>
<p><b>Illuminated manuscript</b> Handwritten books that have been decorated with ornamental designs and/or miniatures.</p>	<p><b>Lapis Lazuli</b> Valuable deep-blue mineral composed mainly of lazurite with smaller quantities of other minerals, used mainly as a gem or as a pigment for manuscripts.</p>
